How to get an Indiana driver's license

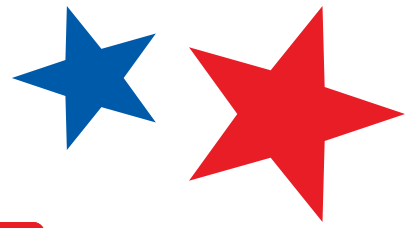

The Road to Freedom



STEP 1: TAKE DRIVER EDUCATION

Teen driver education in Indiana consists of 30 hours of classroom time and six hours of behind-the-wheel drives. The student must be at least 15 years old to begin driver education. If the student is 16 or older, they don't need to take driver education and can skip to Step 3.

STEP 2: GET CDE

As soon as the student enrolls in behind-the-wheel training, they should ask the company they registered with for a Certificate of Driver Education Enrollment (CDE). This certificate proves that a student has enrolled in driver education. Once a student obtains their CDE, they can begin the process of getting their permit.

STEP 3: PERMIT PROCESS

When the student has their CDE, they should take it to the BMV to complete a knowledge exam and a vision screening. If the student is 16 or older, they don't need a CDE to take this exam. However, everyone must bring proof of their identity, proof of their social security number, proof of their lawful status and two documents proving Indiana residency. When the student passes the knowledge exam and the vision screening, they will receive a paper permit and their laminated permit will be mailed.

STEP 4: PRACTICE DRIVING

Once the student has their permit, they can start the required 50 hours of behind-the-wheel practice, including 10 hours of night driving, with a licensed parent or guardian who is at least 25 years old. Make sure to keep a detailed drive log, which can be found at in.gov/bmv/licenses-permits-ids/learners-permits-and-drivers-licenses-overview/drivers-license-and-permit-forms. The student should also let their car insurance company know that they are on the road.

STEP 5: TAKE A DRIVING TEST

After the student completes driver education, has had their permit for at least 180 days and has completed the required supervised driving, they will be eligible to take a driving test. Students should take driver education and behind-the-wheel training with All Star before taking their road test with us. Make sure to bring proof of completion of driver education, a completed and signed Log of Supervised Driving and a parent or guardian.

STEP 6: GET PROBATIONARY LICENSE

Once the student passes their driving test, they will receive their probationary license! Please note that to obtain a probationary license the student must be at least 16 years and 90 days old if they took driver education, or 16 years and 270 days old if they did not take driver education.
