

Ohio Driver Education

How to Obtain an Ohio Driver license.

- Step 1: Complete an All Star Ohio Teen Driver Education Program
- Step 2: Apply for a Temporary Instruction Permit Identification Card (TIPIIC)
- Step 3: Complete required behind-the-wheel training.
- Step 4: Complete 50 hours of supervised practice driving.
- Step 5: Pass the Driving Skills Test.
- Step 6: Apply for a Probationary Driver License.

At the age of 18 students become eligible for an unrestricted driver's license.

Ohio Licensing Levels


The Graduated Driver Licensing Law aims to protect teen drivers while they gain experience behind the wheel.

1. **Temporary Instruction Permit**- Students can apply at the age of 15 years and 5 months old if they are enrolled in a Driver Education program.
2. **Probationary Driver's License**- At the age of 16 years old, after passing the road test, students may receive a Probationary Driver's License.
3. **Full License** - No Restrictions, is accessible at 18 years old.

The Road to Freedom



Step 1: Complete Driver Education

Students become eligible at 15 years and 5 months old. The program includes 24 hours of classroom or online instruction, and 8 hours of behind-the-wheel training. Behind-the-wheel training can be scheduled after completing either the classroom or online training and obtaining an instruction permit.

Step 2: Apply for a Temporary Instruction Permit Identification Card (TIPIC)

At the age of 15 years and 6 months old, students become eligible for the TIPIC, which is a required document to begin behind-the-wheel training. To apply for a TIPIC you will need:

- Parent authorization
- Knowledge and vision screening

Step 3: Complete Behind-the-Wheel Training

Online students have 180 days to complete the online course and an additional 180 days to finish behind-the-wheel instruction. Meanwhile, in-person students are granted 180 days to complete both classroom sessions, and behind the wheel training. Eight hours of behind-the-wheel instruction is required. Additional training is available if needed. When program requirements are met, a Certificate of Completion is emailed to the student.

Step 4: Supervised Practice Driving

Upon receiving a Certificate of Completion, students must complete 50 hours of supervised practice driving with a parent or guardian, including 10 hours at night. The student must obtain a [Fifty Hour Affidavit](#) notarized and signed by their parent or guardian to obtain their license.

Behind-the-wheel instruction, which is part of Driver Education, cannot be counted as part of a student's practice driving hours.

Step 5: Pass the Driving and Skills Test

Students are eligible to attempt the Driving and Skills test at the age of 16 years old, after holding a TIPIC for six months and completing the Fifty Hour Affidavit. [Information about Driving and Skills Testing Requirements on road test day:](#)

Step 6: Apply for Probationary License

Upon passing the driving test, the student will be issued their Probationary license. View [Probationary license restrictions](#) for additional details. At the age of 18 students become eligible for an unrestricted driver's license.
