## How to Obtain an Ohio Driver license.

## **Ohio Licensing Levels**

The Graduated Driver Licensing Law aims to protect teen drivers while they gain experience behind the wheel.

- 1. **Temporary Instruction Permit-** Students can apply at the age of 15 years and 5 months old if they are enrolled in a Driver Education program.
- 2. **Probationary Driver's License-** At the age of 16 years old, after passing the road test, students may receive a Probationary Driver's License.
- 3. **Full License -** No Rescrictions, is accessible at 18 years old.

# The Road to Freedom



#### **Step 1:** Complete Driver Education

Students become eligible at 15 years and 5 months old. The program includes 24 hours of classroom or online instruction, and 8 hours of behind-thewheel training. Behind-the-wheel training can be scheduled after completing either the classroom or online training and obtaining an instruction permit.

#### Step 3: Complete Behind-the-Wheel Training

Online students have 180 days to complete the online course and an additional 180 days to finish behind-the-wheel instruction. Meanwhile, in-person students are granted 180 days to complete both classroom sessions, and behind the wheel training. Eight hours of behind-the-wheel instruction is required. Additional training is available if needed. When program requirements are met, a Certificate of Completion is emailed to the student.

#### Step 5: Pass the Driving and Skills Test

Students are eligible to attempt the Driving and Skills test at the age of 16 years old, after holding a TIPIC for six months and completing the Fifty Hour Affidavit. Information about Driving and Skills Testing. Requirements on road test day:

- **Driver Education Certificate of Completion**
- **TIPIC**
- Fifty Hour Affidavit
- Parent or guardian authorization
- License Fee

Step 2: Apply for a Temporary Instruction Permit Identification Card (TIPIC)

At the age of 15 years and 6 months old, students become eligible for the TIPIC, which is a required document to begin behind-the-wheel training. To apply for a TIPIC you will need:

- <u>Proof of identity documentation</u>
- Permit Fee
- Parent authorization
- Knowledge and vision screening
- TIPIC Restrictions for Minors documentation.

### Step 4: Supervised Practice Driving

Upon receiving a Certificate of Completion, students must complete 50 hours of supervised practice driving with a parent or quardian, including 10 hours at night. The student must obtain a Fifty Hour Affidavit notarized and signed by their parent or quardian to obtain their license.

\*\*Behind-the-wheel instruction, which is part of Driver Education, cannot be counted as part of a student's practice driving hours.\*\*

#### Step 6: Apply for Probationary License

Upon passing the driving test, the student will be issued their Probationary license. View Probationary <u>license restrictions</u> for additional details. At the age of 18 students become eligible for an unrestricted driver's license.
